	<p>AP1: Circulation of note of meeting: completed. AP2: Old DDCC website to be closed down: ongoing. AP9: DDCC noticeboards: ongoing</p> <p>Parking: It had been noted that new double yellow lines had been added at the small roundabout on Edinburgh Road. Caledonian Foods outlet had been opened within Grandisons premises on Edinburgh Road. 4	Police Report	
	<p>PC Dan Clarke provided a police report for November 2018 which included recorded and detected crime statistics and highlights of some individual crimes.</p> <p>Dan was asked whether there might be a link between a vehicle on Glebe Street being found with its fuel cap open and a scorched tissue inserted and a previous vehicle fire on Mitchell Street. He was unable to confirm if there was any link.</p> <p>Dan reported that the Friday evening football at the Cowden Pavilion was proving to be successful so far with up to 25 young people attending.</p> <p>While this was not a police matter, the recent unfortunate traffic accident in which a car mounted the pavement on the High Street, Dalkeith and injured a pedestrian was discussed. CH suggested the installation of crash barriers to prevent a recurrence. However, there was not general support for this within DDCC.</p>	

5	Councillors' Reports	
	<p>Cllr Russell reported that grant applications had been processed and decisions were in the public domain. A number of third sector organisations had been negatively impacted.</p> <p>Investing in Communities: Woodburn and Dalkeith was now at Stage 2 of the process. Vote 100 exhibition by local primary pupils was on at Dalkeith Library.</p> <p>Ian McDougall, author, was drawing together into a publication information relating to David Smith, former local politician and Dalkeith Provost. Mr McDougall had requested £2000 to assist with this work.</p> <p>Discussions with planners were ongoing regarding developers' contributions to enhance community facilities in town centres. Midlothian Federation of Community Councils (MFCC) had suggested that local communities should have more say in relation to this.</p> <p>There would be a full Midlothian Council meeting on 18 December.</p> <p>Cllr Russell further reported that the Short-life Working Group (SLWG) on Dalkeith town centre regeneration had requested continuance for another three meetings to be held by March 2019. She reported that One Dalkeith were no longer involved in the SLWG.</p> <p>King's Park, Dalkeith was being nominated as Midlothian's Centenary Field, a national initiative to protect open spaces in memory of those who had died in World War 1. The three priorities of the Single Midlothian Plan would be continuing for a further three years.</p>

	<p>Edinburgh Airport Noise Advisory Board (EANAB): Andrew reported that the Civil Aviation Authority had reviewed the apparent discrepancy in a report by Edinburgh Airport. They agreed that there had been a discrepancy but argued that this was not as large as had been contended. The CAA had rejected Edinburgh Airport's proposals for new flight paths. Edinburgh Airport appeared to be very willing to work with communities. Louise McIntyre, Edinburgh Airport, would be attending a meeting of FMCC. Cramond CC were looking at health implications caused by noise particularly with a view to night flights.</p>
